The disposal of damaged, redundant and obsolete assets amounts to R348 598 000 (R260 million for movable assets, R28 million for minor assets, R0,132 million for computer software and R59 million for immovable assets). It has been noticed that officials do not take their responsibility for the assets that were issued to them seriously and that damages and losses of the assets are becoming a challenge for the Province. This includes damages to the immovable assets.

Section 45 of the Public Finance management Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999 as amended) (PFMA) stipulates that: "An official in a department, trading entity or constitutional institution- (e) is responsible for the management, including the safeguarding of assets and the management of the liabilities within that official's area of responsibility."

From the above it clear that every single official that is employed by government is responsible for the assets (furniture, vehicles, computers, etc.) allocated to him/her,and therefore <u>must</u> understands the necessity for asset control and management thereof according to prescribed policies and procedures and do not cause damage or loss to assets.

The understanding of the safeguarding of assets against damage and loss must start at the lowest levels and increase with post levels until it reaches the full responsibility for the maintenance and safeguarding of assets with the Accounting Officer.

COMPLIANCE TO SECTION 45(e) OF THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT ACT

The Provincial Treasury recommends that the need to manage assets provided in line with section 45 (e) of the PFMA , that this provision should be included in the performance agreements of all officials as from 1 April 2013.
