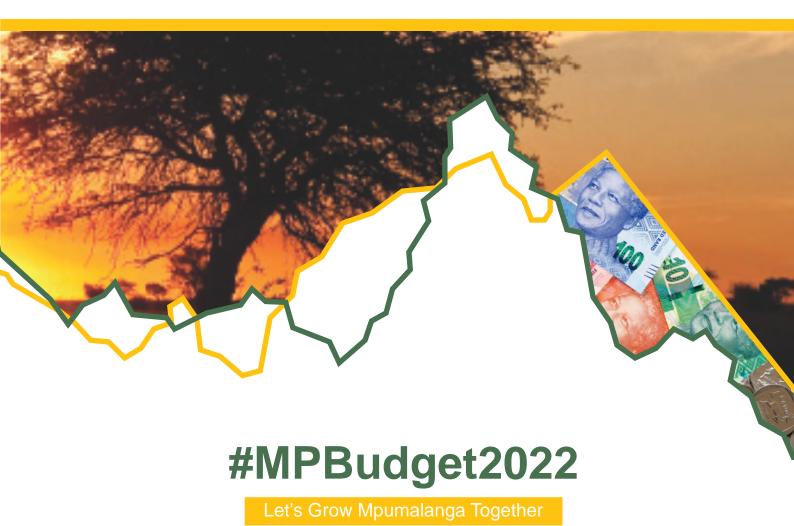
MPUMALANGA BUDGET SUMMARY









The 2022 Mpumalanga Provincial Budget indicates how much revenue the Provincial Government expects to get and specifies the spending choices for the year commencing 1 April 2022.

The approach of the Provincial Government is to use the budget as an instrument of change to improve the socio-economic profile of the communities in the Province.

The Provincial Budget for 2022/23 gives effect to the priority programmes of the sixth administration.
