(As introduced in the Provincial Legislature as a section 120 Bill)

(MEC FOR FINANCE)

#### MPUMALANGA ADJUSTMENT APPROPRIATION ACT, 2008

To appropriate adjusted amounts of money from the Provincial Revenue Fund for the requirements of the Province in respect of the financial year ending 31 March 2009 and to provide for subordinate matters incidental thereto.

#### **PREAMBLE**

WHEREAS section 226(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 (Act No. 108 of 1996) provides that money may be withdrawn from the Provincial Revenue Fund only in terms of an appropriation by a Provincial Act;

**AND WHEREAS** section 26 of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No.1 of 1999), read with section 31, provides that the Provincial Legislature must appropriate money for each financial year for the requirements of the Province;

**BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED** by the Provincial Legislature of the Province of Mpumalanga, as follows:

#### **Definitions**

1. In this Act, unless the context indicates otherwise, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Public Finance Management Act, 1999, has the meaning assigned to it in that Act and —

"Act" includes the Schedule;

"current payments" means any payments made by a Provincial department in respect of the operational requirements of that department, and includes, amongst others, payments for the compensation of employees, goods and services, interest, rental of immovable property and financial transactions relating to assets and liabilities, but exclude transfers and subsidies, and payments for capital assets;

"transfers and subsidies" means any payments made by a Provincial department to another organ of state or any other person in respect of which the Provincial department does not receive anything of similar value directly in return, and includes the payment of conditional grants;

"payments for capital assets" means any payments made by a Provincial department -

- (a) for assets that can be used continuously or repeatedly in production for more than one year, and from which future economic benefits or service potential is expected to flow directly to the Provincial department making the payment; and
- (b) that must be classified as or deemed to be payments for capital assets in accordance with the "Reference Guide to the new Economic Format" (November 2003, Version 2) and the "Asset Management Framework" (April 2004, Version 3.3), issued by the National Treasury under section 76 of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999.

"Public Finance Management Act, 1999" means the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999); and

### Appropriation of adjusted amount of money for the requirements of the **Province**

- (1) Adjusted appropriations by the Mpumalanga Provincial Legislature of 2. money from the Provincial Revenue Fund for the requirements of the Province in the 2008/09 financial year, to votes and main divisions within a vote, and for the specific listed purposes, are as set out in the Schedule.
- (2) Subject to section 3, spending of appropriations is subject to the Public Finance Management Act, 1999.

### Appropriation listed as specifically and exclusively

3. Despite the provisions of any other law, appropriations to a vote or main divisions within a vote that are listed as specifically and exclusively may only be utilised for the purpose indicated and may not be used for any other purpose, unless a Provincial Act amends or changes the purpose for which it was allocated.

### Short title and commencement

4. This Act is called the Mpumalanga Adjustment Appropriation Act, 2008.
